Directed discussion	Most classes will include time for discussion and conversation in pairs or groups. Supervision by teachers.
Supervised projects	Students will write an assignment of about 10 pages A4 (Times New Roman 12, double space) where (s)he describes a
	treatment or therapy belonging to her/his speciality, or another topic, with prior confirmation of its appropriateness from the
	teacher. The assignment should resepect the structure: (Introduction, Body text, Discussion and Conclusion)
Oral presentation	The presentation, probably in class time, should last about 5 minutes, and will usually be based on the " supervised
	project".



Mixed	Exam at the end of the course, including exercises, a short composition and a listening test.
