### Assessment comments

**CONTINUOUS EVALUATION** Continuous evaluation criteria: development of an obligatory work IN GROUP (30 %), presentation of the work (20 %), development exam (30 %), exam of objective questions (30 %). **GLOBAL EVALUATION** compulsory individual work supervised by the teachers (20 %), written exam (40 %), oral exam (40 %). All the tests must be passed in order to pass the subject, which implies that a minimum of 2 points must be obtained in the written exam, 2 points in the oral exam and 1 point in the compulsory work. and 1 point in the compulsory work.
