Topic 1: Basic and introductory fundamentals of the voice	Fundamental concepts and anatomical-physiological memory. Hearing: acoustics and vocal parameters. Musicality, musical ear and types of voices. Professional voice evaluation.
Topic 2: The professional voice	The voice as a working tool. Importance of vocal therapist training. Voice professions and vocal requirements: teachers, singers, actors and other professionals. Sung voice and spoken voice. Differences. Sung voice: body schema and proprioceptive sensitivities. Normal voice and pathological voice: reminder. Types of professional dysphonia.
Topic 3: Vocal technique and hygiene measures	Vocal hygiene measures for the correct use of the voice. Vocal technique for the correct use of the voice: body scheme/posture, breathing, relaxation, pronunciation, prosody and imposition. Semi-occluded vocal tract exercises for the sung and spoken voice. Most common errors: awareness and indications for their correction.
Topic 4: Diction technique for public speaking	Body language and voice. Speech rhythm and stress management. Speech organization. Use of microphone and telephone. Oral expression in the media and social networks.

Case study	The professor will present clinical cases related to the contents.
Clinical practice placement	They will serve to give examples of vocal errors and their correct use.
Guest lecture / keynote speech	The theoretical contents will be taught with the practical ones, consecutively. The theoreticians will be taught in a master session with support for slides and videos. And the practical part through practical exercises related to the theoretical explanation.
Objective test	Multiple choice exam with theoretical-practical content
Supervised projects	Preparation of intervention material based on guidelines provided by the teacher.

Supervised projects	This is a group work that can be developed with the tutored help of the lecturer and that will be closely linked to the clinical practices that will be carried out during the interactive classes. Students who do not regularly attend the interactive classes (either due to academic dispensation or for other reasons) must join a working group with classmates who regularly attend the classes. In addition, all students will be able to consult any doubts that may arise through online or face-to-face tutoring.

Assessment comments

In order to pass the course it is necessary to obtain a 5 out of 10 in the objective test and in the tutored work. The attendance to the interactive classes is essential to be able to carry out the tutored work because it is based on the exposition of the knowledge and learning acquired in the interactive classes. The objective test-exam is 30% of the final grade and the tutored work is 70%. However, in the case of students with part-time dedication, academic dispensation with exemption of attendance or students who do not comply with a minimum attendance of 75% must catch up with the progression of the classes and join one of the working groups of students who regularly attend class if they want to score their tutored work. In the case of students with less than 75% of class attendance (whether due to part-time dedication, academic dispensation or absences with or without justification), the weighting of the grades will be the inverse, with the exam having a weight of 70% of the final grade and the supervised projects 30%.

All aspects related to ?academic dispensation?, ?dedication to the study?, ?permanence? and ?academic fraud? will be ruled according to the current academic regulations of the UDC.
